



In 2015, Governor Dayton signed into law [Minnesota Statute 103F.48](#), which requires the establishment of buffers of permanent vegetation on certain water bodies across the state. The required buffer widths and deadlines for establishment vary by water body: Public Waters: a buffer of 50ft average width, 30ft minimum, must be in place by November 1st, 2017.

Public Ditches: a buffer of 16.5ft must be in place by November 1st, 2018.

The DNR has created a final buffer protection map which can be found [here](#). This map delineates where buffers are required and how wide they need to be. This webpage also contains additional resources and information on how the map was created. The map has undergone multiple changes since it was released. Streams may have been added or removed, or required widths may have changed.

Rice SWCD will be the primary source for implementing the buffer law. We are available to help with compliance determinations and planning. ### **Compliance Review**

The Rice SWCD will perform a compliance review of buffer implementation for Rice County. All parcels in the county are to be reviewed within a 3-year timeframe. The Rice SWCD will review 1/3 of all parcels each year. In addition, it will conduct random spot checks on 25 parcels each year outside of the scheduled area.
