#### **REGULAR BOARD MEETING MINUTES**

Meeting called to order at 8:00 am by Chairman Richard Peterson.

### **July Board Minutes:**

A motion by John Larson, seconded by Gene Kuntz to approve the July board minutes as written. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

### July financial statement and bills payable:

The district manager reviewed the financial statement and bills payable for July.

A motion by Gene Kuntz, seconded by Al Malecha to approve the July financial statement and bills payable, subject to audit. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

A. Project encumbrance report – information: this report was reviewed.

## **CONSENT AGENDA: (payment approval):**

A motion by John Larson, seconded by Gene Kuntz to approve the consent agenda items. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

### A. RCPP Soil Health Policy – action:

This agenda item was a last-minute addition to the meeting. District Manager reviewed the proposed policy for the new RCPP grant. This grant is federally funded but managed thru BWSR. NRCS guidelines will be followed.

A motion by Gene Kuntz, seconded by John Larson to approve the RCPP soil health policy as presented. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

Discussion: can you do a partial farm under the strip-till practice? Yes, you can.

### B. Dew Drop Drill - consider sale - action:

The current Dew Drop Drill was purchased in 2015. It is used, on average, 6 to 8 times annually. District Manager has done some research and average re-sale value is between \$3,000 and \$6,000.

A motion by John Larson, seconded by Al Malecha to sell the 2015 Dew Drop Drill for \$4,500.00. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

# C. <u>Dew Drop Drill – consider purchase of new machine - action:</u>

The new Dew Drop drills have a remote controller, instead of the cord running between the machine and ATV. It also comes with tines instead of discs. District Manager recommends purchasing a new dew drop drill with the tines, for \$9,000.00. Shipping cost is \$600.00 but the District Manager would pick it up.

A motion by John Larson, seconded by Al Malecha to approve the purchase of a new Dew Drop Drill, with the additional tines for \$9,000.00. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

Technical assistance provider did not include the cost of seeding and mulching in the original contract amount. Both of these items are essential components for this project.

A motion by Al Malecha, seconded by John Larson to approve the Kuball Dairy 23-RC-006 amended amount from \$4,522.88 to \$4,600.12. All aye. None opposed. Gene Kuntz abstained.

# G. Mark and Terry Rydberg Trust 25-RC-006, WASCOB - \$61,997.76 - action:

This project is funded thru the Cannon River Watershed Joint Powers Organization. It is located in a Level 1 high priority area so funded at 95% cost share. NRCS staff designed the project.

A motion by Gene Kuntz, seconded by Al Malecha to approve the Mark and Terry Rydberg Trust 25-RC-006 project for \$61,997.76. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

# H. Chris Donkers 25-RC-007, grassed waterway - \$17,217.69 - action:

This project is funded thru the Cannon River Watershed Joint Powers Organization. It is located in a Level 1 high priority area so funded at 95% cost share. NRCS staff designed the project.

A motion by John Larson, seconded by Gene Kuntz to approve the Chris Donkers 25-RC-007, grassed waterway project for \$17,217.69. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

### I. Soil Health practices grant agreement – action:

A motion by Gene Kuntz, seconded by John Larson at approved the Soil Health grant agreement and grant authority to District Manager to sign the grant agreement thru DocuSign. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

# J. Open a money market account with Edward Jones investments – action:

Opening a money market account would make transfer of interest from expiring CD's easier. Would also earn more interest than a standard savings account. District Manager recommends moving some of current savings account into a money market account. Is the money market account FDIC insured? No action taken pending FDIC insurability.

# K. LCCMR Regional Soil Health Program - discussion

The 11 counties in SE Minnesota are working together to get LCCMR funds to assist with groundwater issues. The Legislature still needs to approve in the spring of 2026. If approved, the funding would be available in July. The funds are not a guarantee. The District Manager will convey Rice SWCD's interest in participating in this funding source.

# L. Revise approval authority on soil health practices – action:

The motion approved at the May board meeting authorizes the District Manager to approve soil health practices that are time-sensitive. It would be better to say "non-structural" instead of soil health. In addition, the motion granted this authority through the end of 2025. It is recommended to extend this authority through 2028, which is the end of the RCPP Soil Health grant deadline.

A motion by Gene Kuntz, seconded by John Larson to revise approval authority on soil health practices by substituting "soil health" with "non-structural" and extend this authority through 2028 instead of 2025. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.

## M. <u>Tyrone David LC23-04-CS</u>, <u>WASCOB - \$15,299.63 - action</u>:

This project is for two basins on very hilly and rough ground. Project to be completed this fall.

A motion by John Larson, seconded by Al Malecha to approve the Tyrone David LC23-04-CS contract for a WASCOB in the amount of \$15,299.63. All aye. None opposed. Motion carried.
